## ESTATE DONATIONS POLICY

All designated (restricted) donated funds will be used for the sole purpose for which it was earmarked for by the donating family as soon as appropriately feasible, unless otherwise stipulated within the will of the deceased and/or original terms of the donation.

All undesignated estate funds are to be placed in an internally restricted reserve for the purpose of funding significant capital projects. In order for funds to be withdrawn, the executive director will create a proposal and relevant business case to be presented to the board. Pending board approval, the funds will be released for the design, necessary permitting, and construction of the project. Under no circumstances are the internally restricted estate donations to be used for general operating costs.

Until such a time that the internally restricted estate funds are used they are to held in a separate interest yielding bond account of limited risk exposure. Under no conditions are funds to be used to invest in stocks, shares, EFT's, or any other financial investment that contains inherent financial risk. All interest accrued will remain within the internally restricted estate fund.

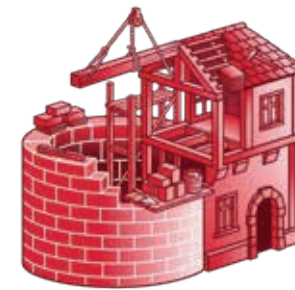

## UPGRADES TO DONOR MANAGEMENT TEMPORARY SOLUTIONS

Reboth Christian Ministries is currently upgrading its donor management system to better serve its supporters and enhance the overall giving experience. This transition is designed to improve communication, streamline donations, and create a more meaningful connection with donors.

During this upgrade period, donations can be made through several temporary options:

As part of the system transition, any existing recurring donations (monthly or annually) will be automatically cancelled. Donors are encouraged to reconnect once the new system is live to set up recurring contributions again. Support is available for anyone who needs assistance during this process.

The team is actively working to complete the upgrade as quickly as possible and will provide updates as soon as the new system is in place. Reboth Christian Ministries extends sincere appreciation for the continued support, patience, and generosity of its donor community, whose contributions make a lasting impact.

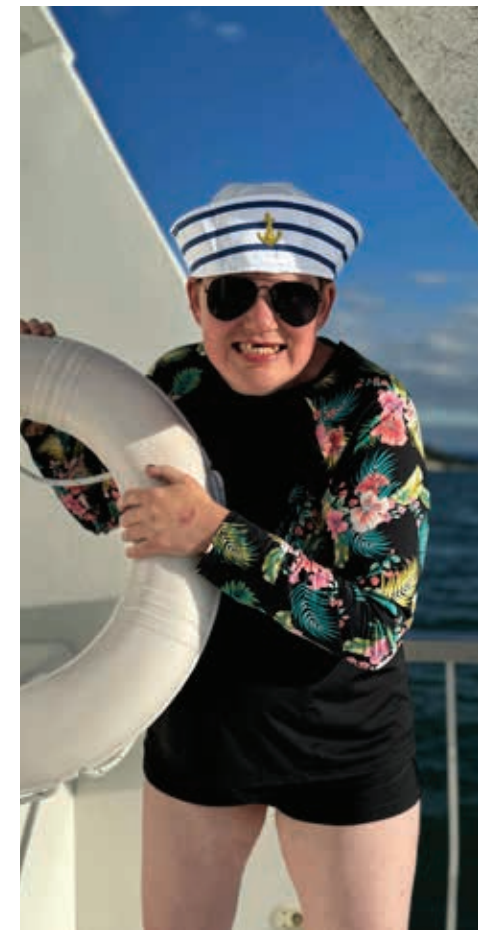

## CELEBRATING A CREATIVE PARTNERSHIP



At the Kutenai Art Therapy Institute, creativity is cherished as a pathway to healing—and this belief resonates beautifully with Rehoboth Christian Ministries’ mission to cultivate places where every person is valued, supported, and able to flourish. Our partnership with KATI continues to be a profound blessing. Their dedication to honouring each individual’s story, nurturing resilience, and affirming our shared humanity reflects the very heart of our work at Rehoboth. We are especially grateful for the students whose generosity has extended to staff and families, offering their gifts far beyond what is required.



Since 2021, the Central Region has welcomed practicum students from across Canada—some joining us virtually, others gathering with us in person in Three Hills. Many students quickly discover that our groups are not just learning environments; they are vibrant communities that spark creativity, encourage authentic connection, and help shape confident, compassionate practitioners.



As we look ahead to 2026, our requested session themes focus on deepening self-awareness, strengthening self-advocacy, and walking alongside individuals through moments of grief and loss. Each session looks a little different: sometimes the room settles into a peaceful hush as participants work with quiet determination, and other days it fills with the sound of bright, shared laughter. But no matter the mood, something meaningful always unfolds. When each person stands to share the story woven into their artwork, their voice grows a little steadier. Their courage is met with encouragement—from peers, from therapists, and from the welcoming space they help create together. These moments remind us that creativity does more than produce art; it builds community, confidence, and connection.

Through this partnership, students and participants co-create a space where creativity becomes a bridge between hearts—and where every story, without exception, is lifted up and honoured.

“As an art therapy intern, my role is to uplift others—but they uplift me too. Even virtually, there’s a sense of belonging...a sacred space where we create, connect, and show care and love to one another while tending to our well-being. It’s as beneficial for me as it is for them, and truly an honor.”
